Uniform to be worn in school is:


- Blue sweatshirt preferably with school logo
- White polo shirt
- Black/grey trousers/shorts black or grey skirt/ pinafore
- Blue checked summer dress (warmer weather)
- Black shoes (without heel) tights to be black or arey
- 1 pair of stud earrings is permitted to be worn in school

PE Kit

- Each child should have a P.E. kit in school all week
- The kit should contain shorts, long trousers in winter,
 T-shirt and trainers
- All earrings should be removed (by the child)
 before P.E and all long hair should be tied back

Please can you make sure that **ALL** items of clothing are named. At this age children are not always good at keeping track of their clothes and it is difficult to reunite unnamed items with the correct owners.

We recognize that the start of a new year, a new teacher and a new classroom can take a bit of getting used to and children adapt at different speeds. Don't panic if your child takes a little while to settle in.

Teachers are always happy to talk to you about your children and can do so briefly at the start of the day. However if it isn't passing on a quick message, after school is better as teachers need to get inside with their class.

Behaviour

Attitudes to learning

Last year we successfully introduced our 'Good to be Green' system that encouraged the children to make the right choices and be rewarded for them. For those of you new to this, the children start the day with a green card. If they make the right choices the card stays green all day. Children who have been green all week earn their full 'Golden time' session on Friday afternoons. This year we will also be adding some new initiatives...

- 'silver' and 'gold' cards for children who go above and beyond.
- 'I have been green all week' stamps in reading diaries so parents can see how well children have done.

Each half term children who have been green every week can be chosen for the Head's tea party.

Gold card: You are going above and beyond. You are an 'always' child. Silver card: You make the right choices all the time. Green Card: You are Concentrating and trying your best Sharina. Using good manners and kind words, Willing and enthusiastic Respectful, Listenina Warning Card: Warnin Lose 5 minutes of play time. Make good choices from now on. Do not give up. Consequence Card: Miss a play time.

As well as the card system children in Reception still have sticker charts to fill and in KS1 the children collect Dojo points to earn something from the prize box. If some of their behavior choices start to slip they will receive a verbal warning and

If some of their behavior choices start to slip they will receive a verbal warning and reminder of the correct behavior. If they continue to make the wrong choice they will be given a yellow card which means they miss 5 minutes of their playtime. If this behavior persists then a red card can be given which means they miss their whole playtime. Parents will always be told by the class teacher if red cards have been given, so that we can work together as a team.

In this coming year we will be focusing on Attitudes to Learning - how we can become successful learners. We have chosen 5 areas to focus on: Willingness to learn, resilience, self-motivation, determination and reflection.

We will actively be teaching children about these areas in assemblies and PSHE lessons. We will focus on one each half term and the certificates we give out on Friday assemblies will be linked to this.

Autumn 1- Willingness to learn

This year celebration assemblies will be on a Friday at 9.05am. If your child is chosen to receive a certificate you will receive an invite by text on the Wednesday.

Attendance

The Department of Education states that "Head Teachers should not grant leave of absence unless there are **exceptional circumstances**. The application must be made in advance and we must be satisfied that there are exceptional circumstances based on the individual facts and circumstances of the case which warrant the leave." Holiday forms will be looked at on an individual basis but generally we are not able to authorise family holidays.

Absence procedures

If your child is going to be absent from school please ring the school office before school. A message can be left on the answer machine. Please notify the school on **each day** of the absence, unless otherwise agreed with the head teacher.

Lateness

Once the school gates and doors are closed at **8:50am** the only way to gain access to the school is via the main entrance and school office. Any pupil who comes into school this way from 8:50am is deemed late and must be signed into the school late book. Lateness will be monitored as it disrupts your child's education and that of their class.

Welcome to Mr Jackson, our new caretaker.

Having listened to parent feedback newsletters will now be monthly.



This term we will be starting to use 'Read Write Inc' for our Literacy and Phonics work. The children are taught phonics daily. This means that they learn how to 'read' the sounds in words and how those sounds can be written down. This is essential for reading, but it also helps children learn to spell well. We teach the children simple ways of remembering these sounds and letters. The children also practise reading (and spelling) what we call 'tricky words', such as 'once', 'have', 'said' and 'where'.

The children practise their reading in lessons with words and books that match the phonics and the 'tricky words' they know. They start thinking that they can read and this does wonders for their confidence.

The teachers read to the children too, so the children get to know all sorts of stories, poetry and information books. They learn many more words this way and it also helps their writing.

The books that children bring home are for you to practise at home. Please record this in the Reading Diary. The more the children practice the quicker their progress and the more their confidence will grow, so we recommend reading at least 3 times a week at home.

Your child's teacher will not necessarily practice reading these books with them during the week as they are actively teaching them to read words and comprehend what they read daily in the lessons.

School photographs

The photographers will be in in the morning of Tuesday 11th September. Children who have siblings in the school will automatically be taken for a photograph together as well as their individual. If you have siblings who do not go to RMI and wish to have a photo of the children together then the photographer will be here from 8am so come along then.

Curriculum

We are changing things a little in our approach to our curriculum. In Maths we will be using the Rising Stars resources alongside 'White Rose' to add depth to the children's understanding. We will be using Read Write Inc as the basis for our English, combined with opportunities to write across the curriculum.

When teaching most other subjects we will be talking a question based approach to get the children to think and explore with greater independence.

We will be organizing some workshops during the Year so you can find out about how we teach different subjects.
