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The topic for the second half of Spring Term continues to be 'All Creatures Great and Small'. Please read this letter to find out more about what we will be teaching in each subject area during this half-term. Our website also has more detailed information of how each of these subjects are taught progressively.

# **English**

We will be using the key text 'Hodgeheg' by Dick King-Smith during our English learning this half-term. We will learn the meaning of unfamiliar vocabulary and discuss our opinions on this text, leading to creating a book review. We will learn about how to use commas in a list correctly as well as how to use possessive apostraphes correctly. The Hodgeheg also teaches us a lot about road safety so this will be very useful! We will then be focusing on understanding the differences between fiction and non-fiction texts which will allow the children to learn what the features of non-fiction texts are. We will sequence lessons which will lead to children creating their own non-chrological reports (fact page) about hedgehogs. We very much enjoy linking our English learning to science!

# **Maths**

We will be learning how to divide by using methods of grouping and sharing, linking to our previous knowledge of multiplication. We will then develop our understanding of statistics by creating and interpreting tally charts, pictograms and block charts.

# <u>Art</u>

In art we will be learning about the artist 'Anthony Gormley'. We will look at his artwork and develop our understanding about how he has created different sculptures. We will create and use a design to make our own sculpture out of clay (a hedgehog to link to our English learning). We will then reflect on and evaluate our artwork.



### R.E

Our R.E focus this half-term is based on developing our understanding of the Easter story. We will focus on retelling the Easter story and understanding what Jesus' resurrection means for Christians.

### **Science**

In science we will be developing our understanding of what food chains are and learning about the importance of them. We will also be focusing on knowing that animals, including humans, have offspring that grow into adults; simple life cycles.



# **History**

In history we will learn about the life of Dick King-Smith and understand why he is a famous and significant individual. We will use our learnt knowledge of Dick King-Smith's childhood (school life) from the past and compare this to our school lives now in the present.



### PΕ

We are very lucky this half term to have an external provider teach us all about yoga and mindfulness during our PE sessions. Mr Bourne will be teaching striking and fielding; developing throwing and catching skills.

# **Computing**

Our computing focus for this half term will be developing our knowledge and skills we learnt in Autumn 2 (when learning how to create Word Documents) to create our very own PowerPoint! We will be applying our previous knowledge of using different keys correctly including the space bar, shift key, backspace and enter key. We will also be practising previous skills of changing the way text looks and inserting images safely. We will be learning new skills such as inserting a new slide, exploring animations and infilling the background to create an exciting PowerPoint about Dick King-smith (linking to our history learning).

#### **PSHE**

The PSHE theme for this half-term is 'Healthy Me'. We will learn about different ways we can keep our bodies and minds healthy including healthy eating, exercise and mindfulness strategies. We will also learn about how to stay safe around medicines and the importance of crossing roads safely.

#### Music

In music this half-term we will be learning how to play an instrument called an 'ocarina'. We will learn how to correctly hold the ocarina and use the correct amount of pressure when blowing into the instrument to make a noise. We will learn how to read simple symbols to play the correct note and learn how to copy a rhythmic pattern. Finally, we will be thinking about using dynamics (soft and loud) when performing.
