Staffing

Covid

As you will be aware, the government announced changes to Covid law on Monday. Our priority remains keeping our community safe so please be reassured that we will continue to expect any children testing positive for Covid to isolate for at least 5 days. We will also continue to monitor children and call parents/carers to collect children showing symptoms.

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I am really hopeful that we are moving back to our new normal and that we can resume normal school activities again. We are going to restart our Friday Achievement Assembly for those children selected by their teachers and we are looking to plan some community events in the near future.

New Guidance:

Changes to self-isolation and daily testing of close contacts

From Thursday 24 February, the Government will remove the legal requirement to self-isolate following a positive test. Adults and children who test positive will continue to be advised to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for at least 5 full days, and then continue to follow the guidance until they have received 2 negative test results on consecutive days.

In addition, the Government will:

- No longer ask fully vaccinated close contacts and those aged under 18 to test daily for 7 days, and remove the legal requirement for close contacts who are not fully vaccinated to self-isolate.
- End routine contact tracing. Contacts will no longer be required to self-isolate or advised to take daily tests. Staff, children and young people should attend their education settings as usual. This includes staff who have been in close contact within their household, unless they are able to work from home.

Anyone with symptoms should take a PCR test, stay at home and follow government guidance if positive. People who have tested positive will continue to be advised to stay at home for five full days and then receive two negative test results on consecutive days before returning to their workplace or setting. Staff and pupils who test positive should use any test kits they already have at home to undertake testing on days five and six, before returning to school if they test negative.

Thank you for your continued support in these challenging times. Our priority is to continue to provide face to face teaching for our children. Staff are working hard to cover absences and provide continuity. If you have any questions do please ask.

Please note that we have a final Inset Day in school on Friday 24th June 2022.
