Reading wallets

A message from Miss Justice:

Each child will be coming home with a new, labelled reading wallet. Children are to keep their school reading books and diaries in these wallets (which fit into book bags). Children will now be bringing home three books (2 that are in line with their phonic knowledge/stage of reading and 1 that is a family sharing book). The purpose of the family sharing book is for an adult to read to/with the child. There is a document explaining how you can support your child with reading at home in the wallet.
