Activities:

Read some stories with a rainforest theme / setting or listen to one online, e.g. We're Roaming Through the Rainforest or If I ran the Rainforest. Or watch this video clip and explore the rainforest. Here is a link to an additional video from BBC Teach: Rainforests.

Layers of the rainforest



Use books or the internet to research the layers of the rainforest. A linked PowerPoint is available to access on the 'Family Home Learning Project – The Rainforest' Tapestry post. Can you create your own rainforest picture and label the different layers?



You could access the 'Layers of the Rainforest' game on Purple Mash to see if you can name the layers of the rainforest before the timer runs out!

(Set as a 2Do for Year 1 and Year 2)

Animal Alphabet:

Use books or the internet to research all the different animals you would find in the rainforest. Can you think of an animal for each letter of the alphabet?







Postcard from the rainforest:

You have discovered a rainforest. Write a postcard to your friends at school to tell them about your discovery. Use your senses to describe your findings. What did you see? What sounds could you hear?

<u>Simple City – Endangered animals</u>

Can you create a fact file about an endangered animal from the rainforest? You can choose one of the animals suggested on Purple Mash (and use the provided templates) or choose your own. If using Purple Mash, search for 'rainforest' and then select 'Endangered Animals Factfiles'.





(Not specifically set as a 2Do to allow the children to choose which animal they research).

What Am I?:




Research where chocolate comes from and how it is made:
